What is a Police Investigation?

An investigation is carried out to ascertain:

- Whether a crime has been committed or not; and
- If so can a suspect be identified; and
- If so can the suspect be made amenable

Investigation Process

1.Initial Report received

6.Interview Suspect

7. Submit Forensics

2.Identify & Secure Scenes

5.House to house, CCTV etc

8.Prepare File

3.Interview Victims & Witnesses

4.Examination of Scenes

9.Submit File to PPS

<u>Neglect</u>

Neglect is the failure to meet a child's basic needs, whether it be adequate food, clothing, hygiene, supervision or shelter that is likely to result in the serious impairment of a child's health or development. Children who are neglected also suffer from other types of abuse.


Cruelty - S20 CYPA (NI) 1968

'If any person who has attained the age of sixteen and has responsibility for any child or young person under that age wilfully

assaults, ill treats, neglects, abandons or exposes him or causes or procures him to be assaulted, ill treated, neglected, abandoned or exposed in a manner likely to cause him unnecessary suffering or injury to health that person shall be guilty of an offence...'


